

FY 2025 COMMON CARDIAC MCCS AND CCs

Each year CMS updates the list of diagnoses classified as Major Complications and Comorbidities (MCCs) and Complications and Comorbidities (CCs). These annual changes go into effect October 1, the beginning of the Medicare Part A (Inpatient care) fiscal year.

- Complications describe conditions that arise during an inpatient admission (POA = N)
- Comorbidities denote conditions that existed prior to admission (POA = Y)
